



ACTS Seminaries is an educational meeting place, where faculty and students come together in the conviction that more can be learned through cooperation than in isolation.

We are a partnership of four denominational seminaries - each of whom bring a unique history and approach to their love for Jesus and their desire to live out the gospel in the church and the world.

Getting Started

Registration & Tuition Payment

Go to <u>twu.ca/help</u> — select "Courses, Fees, and Enrolment"

Need to contact the Registrar's Office? Select "Service Hub" near the top of the twu.ca/help page.

Student Email Account

Students must set up their student email account (@mytwu.ca). All student communications will go to this account.

In Outlook's settings, you can forward emails to your personal email account, so you don't miss anything.

To set up your email account, log into the Student Services Hub at twu.ca/help and click the "myTWU Email" button.

Parking

Pay parking is in effect at all times. The easiest way to pay for parking through the PayByPhone app.

You can buy hourly, daily, or weekly passes at parking meters located in each lot. For permits for an entire academic year, please visit the TWU parking services webpage at twu.ca/parking-services.

Medical Insurance

ALL STUDY PERMIT STUDENTS must visit the Wellness Centre located on the second floor of the Douglas Centre to purchase medical insurance, if you have not already done so.

Student ID Card

Your Student ID Card is what you will need to borrow books from TWU's library and access resources, like the Fitness Centre.

Zoom

As a TWU student, you get a free premium Zoom account with unlimited Zoom calls. To access this,

- 1. Go to the Zoom login page
- 2. Scroll down and click the key icon labeled "SSO"
- 3. Type in "twu" on the next page
- 4. Login with your "@mytwu.ca" username and password

Frequently Asked QUESTIONS

Q: How is ACTS Seminaries related to Trinity Western University?

ACTS Seminaries is a partnership of four seminaries that form a graduate school of theological studies at TWU. ACTS students are TWU students, and ACTS alumni are TWU alumni. This means that as an ACTS student, you get access to all services provided by TWU.

Q: What does it mean that I am a part of a certain seminary within the ACTS Seminaries partnership?

Being part of a seminary helps create networking opportunities in the associated denomination, and the faculty from each seminary pray for their students. There are also distinct financial aid options available for students of each seminary. In addition, the name of your seminary will be printed on your diploma when you graduate.

Q: How much time do I need to devote to my studies?

For weekly on-campus or live-stream courses, expect to spend 8-10 hours per week, including time in class. For online courses, expect to spend 15 hours per week, including pre-recorded lectures. Essentially, each credit will require about forty hours of work.

Q: Where do I find information regarding my academic or financial needs? For all the most important information, go to the Student Services Hub at twu.ca/help.

There you will find links to course registration and to your financial statement. Any questions can be directed to the appropriate department by clicking "Service Hub".

QUESTIONS (continued)

O: How does financial aid work?

There are three options for financial aid:

- 1. TWU need-based awards
- 2. TWU endowment awards. Endowment awards are typically reserved for students taking 5 credit hours or more each fall and spring term
- 3. Seminary-specific awards. Seminaries have more flexibility to offer financial aid to part-time students. Contact your seminary for more information.

NOTE: There are no TWU financial aid options available for the summer term. Applications for the upcoming academic year (September to April), open in mid-January.

Q: How do I know what classes I need to take?

"My Course Needs" tool will be one of your greatest assets during your journey at ACTS. It is a template with a list of all the courses in your specific program and it tells you exactly which courses you have completed and which ones you still need to complete.






Fosmark Centre Map
